BOTTOM LINE: Trust and obey, even when you think your way is better.

Read Luke II:28

## Simon Says

God asks us to trust and obey Him in what we say and do. Play "Simon Says" with your family, which is a game that will help you to practice obeying.

Here is how to play: One person is designated Simon, the others are the players. Simon will stand in front of the group telling players what they must do. The players must only obey commands that begin with the words "Simon Says." If Simon says, "Simon says touch your nose," then players must touch their nose. But, if Simon simply says, "clap," without first saying "Simon says," players must not clap. Those that do clap are out. Keep playing with different commands from Simon.

**KNOW** that when you trust and obey God it will always be the best choice.

#### Trusty Drawing

Grab some paper, something to draw with, and someone to help you! Your job is to draw whatever the person tells you draw, with your eyes closed! Although you might think keeping your eyes open is the better way, try your best to trust the other person to lead you! The person helping you is going to read the following directions to you! No peeking ahead!

Drawing directions: Draw a square. On top of the square draw a triangle. Inside of the square draw a rectangle. Now open your eyes! Guess what you drew.

LOOK for ways that you can trust others even when you think your way is better.

# Obey the Motions

Use the following motions to help yourself remember this week's Bible verse: Luke II:28!

"He replies, Instead, blessed (hands raised above your head)

are those who hear (put your hands up to your ears)

> God's (point up)

word and obey
(thumbs up)

it."

ASK God to help you remember to listen and obey His word, even when you think your way is better.
