

BOTTOM LINE: If you want to be wise, trust God to give you wisdom.

Read Proverbs 3:5-6

## A Straight Path

With an adult's help, write out the words of **Proverbs 3:5-6** on separate cards. Place the cards on the floor to create a winding pathway. Walk on each card as you say the verse out loud. Now rearrange the cards to make a straight path. Which path was easier to walk on? Was it the winding path or the straight one?

When you choose to follow God and ask Him what He wants you to do, He will help you choose the path that is ALWAYS best.

**THANK** God for His wisdom and His willingness to help you grow wise.

## Verse Karaoke

Ask an adult to help you sing the words of this week's verse to the tune of "Are You Sleeping."

Trust in the Lord (Are you sleeping)

With all your heart (Are you sleeping)

**Do not depend** (Brother John)

On your own understanding (Brother John) In all your ways obey Him (Morning bells are ringing)

He will make your paths (Morning bells are ringing)

Smooth and straight (Ding, ding, dong)

Proverbs 3:5-6 (Ding, ding, dong)

LISTEN to God and trust in Him so you can grow in wisdom.

## Lean on Me

Find a friend or sibling that is around the same height as you. Sit down on the floor, back to back and lock arms. Now, try to stand up to your feet.

To stand up, you had to push or lean against each other and trust that your partner would keep on leaning until you both made it your feet. This week's verse tells us not to lean on or trust in our own way. Why? Because we can't know everything! But guess what? God does. And we can always trust in Him.

ASK God to help you "lean" on His wisdom and follow Him.

## Trust Test

You put your trust in things everyday. You trust in a chair to hold you up. You trust your scooter to get you to your friend's house.

But what happens when chairs or scooters break? Sometimes we trust in things or people that let us down. But God is always trustworthy. When He promises to show you the way to go, you can trust it's the best way.

**KNOW** that God is completely trustworthy and that He will help you grow wise.
